# 11+ admissions information

Founded in 1552, King Edward's School is one of the most successful and diverse boys' schools in the country. Entry to the School is based on academic merit but we also look for boys who will take full advantage of the educational experience and extra-curricular opportunities on offer.

## 2017 academic results

At GCSE the percentage of A\* grades attained overall was 70% and 90% A\*/A; 34 boys achieved 10 A\*s and 75 boys achieved only A\*s and As.

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma is studied in the Sixth Form, which provides the opportunity for greater breadth of study and an excellent preparation for university. This year 54% of boys achieved 40 points or above: 40 points is the equivalent of more than four A\*s at A-level.

## Extra-curricular life

The School provides a vast range of opportunities in sport, music, drama, trips and outdoor activities, including over 50 clubs and societies. Recent additions to the School's extensive facilities include the £2.5 million Southall Pavilion and astro hockey pitch. A new sports hall and gym are currently under construction.

## Application information

Application deadline: Thursday, 20 September 2018

Entrance examination: Saturday, 6 October 2018

The exam consists of papers in English, mathematics and verbal reasoning. A headteacher's report is requested from the boy's current school and a considerable number of boys are invited to attend an interview.

N.B. The School is not a state-maintained grammar school. Parents do not have to list the School on the 11+ preference form for their Local Education Authority.

## Fees

Fees for the 2017/2018 academic year are £12,735 per annum (£4,245 per term).

## Scholarships

### Academic scholarships

Academic scholarships are awarded based on performance in the entrance exam, a school report and an interview. Up to 20 academic scholarships are available each year, ranging in value from 5% to 50% of the annual School fees.

### Music scholarships

Candidates are expected to be of a high standard and must audition to be considered.

## Assisted Places

There are up to 20 Assisted Places offered each year, many of which are free places. Assisted Places are means-tested up to a total family income of about £72,000. An income of less than £20,000 could entitle a boy to a free place and it is then a sliding scale to the income threshold.
