The shared joy of reading with your children doesn't stop when you can read, it opens up new doors, opportunities and conversations whatever age they are.

<u>PE Kit Reminders</u>: Our PE kit is very simple and is worn, without exception, from Reception through to Year 6. Children are expected to change for physical education activities and parents should provide the following items.

Key Stage One (Reception to Year 2) PE Kit

Girls House t-shirt (colour) plain white sports socks; black pumps, navy blue gym shorts (but not cycling shorts). Tracksuit and trainers for outdoor games preferably plain navy blue or black.

Boys House t-shirt (see above) plain navy shorts (elasticated waist) plain white sport socks; pumps. Tracksuit and trainers for outdoor games preferably plain navy blue or black.

Key Stage Two (from Year 3 -6)

Girls House t-shirt (see above) navy blue gym shorts (not cycling); plain white socks; trainers and tracksuit for outdoor games preferably plain navy blue or black.

Boys House t-shirt (see above) plain navy shorts, one pair with elasticated waist for PE, one pair for outdoor; plain, white or blue, long sleeve soccer shirt , trainers and tracksuit for outdoor games preferably plain navy blue or black, red soccer socks, soccer boots (optional).

A named drawstring bag should be provided to keep PE clothing tidy.
