
Children's Mental Health Week

Nursery

YR 1 & YR 2

Year 1 and 2 children have had a really busy week!

Year 1's have been making 'Wild Thing' hand puppets in DT, to go along with their 'wild writing', where they have been using new skills, including the suffixes 'ing' and 'ed'. The children have also been using "!" and "?" To vary their sentences. Year 2 children have also been improving their writing by combining an ever increasing range of skills. They have prepared and created superb recounts of Neil Armstrong's life, using conjunctions, prepositions and expanded noun phrases! What a wonderful week of writing!

KS2

Year 6 have had a very exciting start to 2020 with the introduction of their new theme, 'London'. In literacy, we have started studying Shakespeare's play, 'Macbeth', and will soon be writing our very own versions of the opening scene! We will also be reading a new class text, 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty, which focuses on what life was like in Victorian London. Furthermore, we have been very busy over the last three weeks preparing for our class assemblies in which the children had a fantastic opportunity to showcase not only their learning but also their many talents, which ranged from dancing, singing and even beatboxing! 6AB's 'London Calling' assembly took us on an exhilarating journey on the Underground to some of the city's most iconic locations while introducing us to many of the historic and literary figures that call London home. Similarly, 6CW's 'Take Me Back to London' assembly looked at some of the moments that have defined the nation's capital in recent years. We would like to extend our thanks to all the parents for their ongoing support at home, from rehearsing lines to helping design some fantastic costumes. We are extremely proud of all the Year 6's for their hard work and dedication. We can't wait to start working on our summer production with this talented bunch!

Language Base

LB1

LB1 have been continuing with their exploration of Julia Donaldson texts, including The Gruffalo's Child and Zog. We have created role play drama shows as well as designing a new character to appear in the story as part of Zog's class. We then used the idea to design our own biscuits using a range of skills to decorate the biscuit as a dragon. Our Year 1's have spent a lot of time with 1SH preparing for and presenting 1SH class assembly. The LB1 pupils thoroughly enjoyed their time with 1SH and were made to feel part of the class. Thank you Miss Holmes. Finally, although a long time away, LB1 have been introduced to the song, 'The Mighty Jungle' as preparation for their class dance for a SEND event to be held in April. We explored rhythm using percussion instruments and played beats linked to the music. The pupils loved the choice of song and now cannot wait for Miss Troth's wonderful dance routine. Chinese New Year was celebrated with lanterns and riddles, multiplication mosaics and art in LB2. Most lanterns went home and we hope that you enjoyed working out the riddles. In maths, we have been busy with two step word problems and our grammar task has been on inverted commas.
