What Henry wanted more than anything in the whole wide world, even more than chips, was a dog... only Year 2 are creating their own stories with their own favourite pets! Do ask them to explain why they've made their choices! They are also studying a pioneer of children's poetic stories, Julia Donaldson. Which is your favourite of her characters?

KS2

KS2 newsletter piece, written by children (5MS).

We, 5MS have been learning about the Amazon rainforest. The Amazon Rainforest is the biggest rainforest in the world, there are an estimated 390 billion trees in it, which is more than the stars in the Milky Way. This is why it is known as the lungs of the Earth. We have been learning about the four layers of a rainforest and the animals that live there. The forest floor, the understorey, the canopy and the emergent layer. In art, we have created some oil pastel and chalk paintings of an animal from the Amazon and created a colour wheel different shades of green to represent the colours found in the Amazon. In literacy, we researched an animal of our own choice in pairs and wrote a nonchronological report and then a poem about this animal after reading 'Tyger Tyger' by William Blake. In theme, we really enjoyed making salt dough into the shape of South America, detailing the geographical features and painting it after it had dried. We also hope you enjoyed our class assembly last Friday.
