That's why we provide relationship lessons in school which follow the PSHE curriculum set out in England using a scheme called Jigsaw. The purpose of PSHE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic education) is to help children realise who they are as people and to support them in finding their place in the world. This term we are learning about healthy relationships and aim to help children identify how they relate to other people and to appreciate their value in a world that is constantly changing. Relationship education focuses on developing knowledge, skills, and personal qualities to help prepare children for life and work. We hope this work will help LHPSN children to live healthily, safely, productively, and responsibly in order to become sociable, active and productive members of society.

Get your child's voice heard and make a difference. The Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, is launching a once-in-a-generation review of children's lives. It's called 'The Childhood Commission' and using 'The Big Ask' will be the largest ever consultation held with children. The survey is asking children and young people what they think is important for their future and what is holding young people back. The Children's Commissioner will use what children and young people tell her to show the Government what they think and what they need to live happier lives. It's an exciting opportunity for every child in England to have their voice heard.

There will be different versions of the survey for the following age groups:

4-5, 6-8, 9-12, 13-17 and 18+

Each version has been professionally designed to be appropriate and has been trialled with children in the relevant age group. There will also be two 'easy read' accessible versions of the survey, one for 6-8 year-olds and one for 9-17 year olds. The survey will be online and available to any child who can access the internet. The survey does not ask respondents to submit any directly identifiable information such as their name.
