Nursery

Year 2

Over the last three weeks in Year 2, we have been reading and writing from a wonderful story called, 'Ossiri and the Bala Mengro', by Richard O'Neill and Katharine Quarmey. It tells the tale of the 'Tattin Folki' who are travelling people and one particular, special girl called Ossiri. She loves music and creates her own instrument, but it sounds dreadful and awakens the terrible ogre, the Bala Mengro. The reading, role play, discussion and writing our children have been inspired to create has been fantastic! They have been so inspired by the book and it's beautiful illustrations. The ogre has been described as 'a terrifying, hairy monster as tall as a mountain'! The children would certainly recommend you read it, plus it has also been a wonderful opportunity to learn about traveller communities.

The last fortnight has been a busy one in Year 4 as the children took part in the Multiplication Tables check. This was optional this year for us to participate in and it really was a great success! All of the participating children worked extremely hard on the very tricky check and all did absolutely wonderfully - showing as a testament to how hard the children and staff have worked on their times tables this year. On my travels through the corridors I have also seen some amazing learning coming out of our other KS2 classrooms. I have heard wonderful learning about Italy coming out of Year 3, some amazing work on the Mayans out of Year 5 and I know the Year 6s have thoroughly enjoyed our work on the Civil Rights Movement in the USA. Keep up the hard work KS2, it is amazing for me to see and hear!
