Year 6 Trip

On Tuesday 15th February, the whole of year 6 went on an educational visit to Birmingham Central Mosque, Our faith guide, Nazreem, taught us all about what life is like as a Muslim and all that it entails. For example, we learnt that Muslim women and men pray in separate spaces and also that people over the age of 12 are expected to pray 5 time a day in order to pay their respects to Allah (their God). We had a tour of the mosque, including a visit to the impressive prayer room - it was enormous! Believe it or not, it could hold up to 3000 people at once and the chandelier, which was hanging in the middle of the room, was donated to the mosque back in 1975, when it was first built and it now estimated to be worth over £250,000! Overall we had an intriguing experience and we all thoroughly enjoyed it! A big thank you to Mr Weston for arranging it for us.
