Reading:

- *Reading accurately by blending sounds in words containing taught graphemes, by accurately blending sounds in unfamiliar words.
- *Develop pleasure in reading, plus understanding and comprehension of texts (including the use of skills and understanding of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and sequencing: VIPERS).

Writing:

- *Spelling: applying GPCs into writing, common exception words, days of the week, the addition of a range of prefixes and suffixes.
- *Handwriting: begin to form lower case and capital letters of correct size, orientation and position relative to one another and form digits 0-9
- *Composition: collect ideas to compose sentences orally before writing them down, sequencing sentences to form short narratives
- *Vocabulary, grammar and punctuation: use spaces between words and begin to punctuate sentences using capital letters, and full stops, question marks or exclamation marks. Capital letters used for names and pronoun I.

Mathematics

Numbers to 100:

- *Counting forwards and backwards, knowing 1 more/less than a given number.

Addition and Subtraction:

- *Add/subtract 1- and 2-digit numbers to 20, use + - = signs, problem solve.

Multiplication and Division of 2, 5, 10:

- *Count in 2s, 5s and 10s; group and share in small quantities to begin to understand multiplication and division.

Fractions:

- *Recognise, find, name halves and quarters of objects, shapes and quantities.

Measurement:

- *Compare, describe and solve practical problems for lengths, heights, mass, capacity and volume, and time (sequencing events in chronological order)
- *Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.

Shape:

- *Recognise and name common 2D and 3D shapes.

Geometry:

- *Describe position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three quarter.

History

- *Seaside Holidays: How have seaside holidays changed over the last 100 years? Changes within living memory.
- *Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole: Why do we remember them? Lives of significant individuals.
- *Great Fire of London: Did the Great Fire of London make London a better or worse place? Events beyond living memory.

Geography

- *What is the U.K. like? Local knowledge, human and physical fieldwork
- *Costa Rica vs Lickey - Would I rather live here or Costa Rica?
