EYFS

Early Years have been saying hello (hola) and goodbye (adiós) in Spanish and are learning to answer the register in Spanish (buenas dias y buenos tardes).



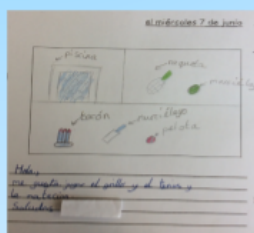
Year 1 and Year 2

Year 1 and 2 have also been answering the register in Spanish as well as counting to 5 (uno, dos, tres, cuatro, cinco) and learning how to say classroom instructions in Spanish - escuchad (listen), mirad (look), silencio (silence). They have also been singing simple Spanish songs.



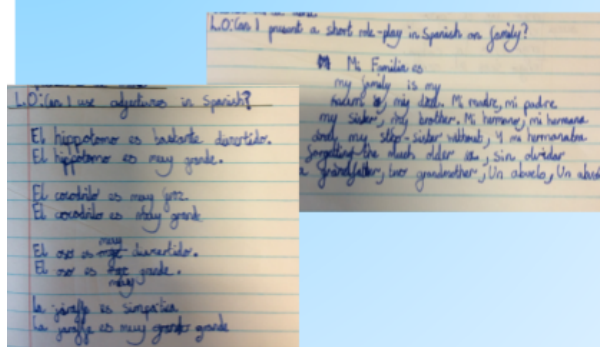
Year 3

In Year 3, the children have been learning how to say the days of the week and the months of the year. They have also continued with their Pen Pal letters from Spain. The letters the children have recently written have been about the hobbies they enjoy doing.



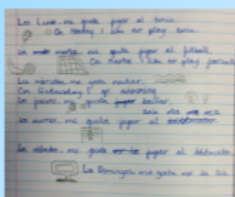
Year 4

In Year 4, the children have been learning how to talk about animals, hobbies, weather and families.



Year 5

In Year 5, the children have been talking about the weather and seasons, saying where they live and what their house is like and comparing UK and Spain.

In Year 6, the children have been talking about different types of accommodation, means of transport and names of places to visit.
